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	 Request submitted for 27 Modular Classroom spaces (the majority of these will go to Airdrie) Need to consider how we manage until new schools are coming on line in Cochrane Indigenous Self-Reflection Activity – this is an activity to understand knowledge related to Indigenous perspectives Additional funding used to support moving Grade 9's out of High Schools in Calgary New Boundary Organization – Ward 5 will become Ward 4 (Wards 2 and 4 were collapsed) and an additional Trustee was added to Cochrane Superintendent has announced that he will be retiring in the fall (this is early but timed with the election); in the process of looking for a new superintendent (there is a survey on RVS Engage related to this) Cochrane Student Spaaces 300 new spaces will be added with the expansion of Bow Valley (minimum 12-18 months) 6 modulars – Fire Side School 2 Modulars go to Cochrane Christian School Schools are being made larger in an attempt to gain cost savings in the near term and prevent the use/need for modular classrooms in the future Letters of support are being submitted to request support for Rockyview 'Spaces for Students'parents voices matter (the Board is asking for help from the parents on this)
